Response:

The college firmly endorses the principle of gender equity in all our systemic processes enveloping the curricular and extracurricular transactions. Our students come from diverse socio-cultural backgrounds and we take conscious efforts to engage them on the issues on gender sensitivity. Gender equity and sensitization starts with empowering women by educating them. Therefore, as per the HPU admission norms to encourage girls to seek higher education, tuition fees exemption is provided to bonafide Himachali girl students also there is relaxation in upper age limit for them. Being a co-educational institution the government college Una is always sensitive and empathetic towards social problems pertaining to girl students. Mentor mentee meetings etc. are organized regularly to make the students aware of the gender equality. A separate NCC unit (1 HP GIRLS BN SOLAN) is also there for girls with the aim **of developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit.**

1. Safe and secure environment

- The campus has 24/7 security services, monitored by CCTV installed at the gates and placed at strategic locations within the college. All the incidents and activities are recorded and displayed on LED display in the Principal's office. Maintenance committee for the same has also been constituted.
- Security guards are always on duty at the college gate during working hours.
- Identity cards are issued to all students and are mandatory for entry into the college.
- The college has discipline committee for continuous monitoring the security on the campus.
- There is an anti-ragging squad in the college to deal with such problems.
- First aid facility is maintained in the college. First-Aid committee and First aid room has already been there in the college.
- Separate washrooms for the male and female teaching staff, non-teaching staff and students are provided.
- Suggestion boxes are established in the college for all students.

2. Girl's common Room

The college has separate girl's common room. The room is facilitated with washroom, dressing mirror and sanitary napkin vending machine and is under the regular supervision of committee.

3. Age relaxation to girl students in admission

Girl students are given age relaxation for admission at UG and PG level as per the government guidelines

4. Tuition fee Exemption

Tuition fees exemption is provided to bonafide himachali girl students.

5. Annual gender sensitization

A dedicated women cell along with grievances & redressal cell has been working actively in the college.





Fig. 7 Girls common room




Fig. 8 CCTV installed in the campus




Fig. 10 Suggestion Boxes installed at various places in the college




Fig. 12 Security guards on duty.
