

Institutional Development Plan

A. About the College

Approximately 10 & 20 km from the towns of Nadaun & Jawalaji, respectively, Govt. College Majheen is situated in the south-easternmost corner of district Kangra in an idyllic and picturesque setting of hilly terrain overlooking river Bias. Sparsely populated area of Majheen is inhabited mostly by poor and backward class people, employed as daily wagers, labourers, factory workers, drivers and workers at shops & dhabas in the towns of Nadaun and Jawalaji.

At the time of its inception in the year 2016, the institution was set up in an old primary school building. With the passage of time, the most of the part of dilapidated old building was declared non-liveable and therefore, dismantled. At the site of dismantled building, two class-rooms, a staff room and an office room were built with the financial assistance from DHE in 2020. Presently, the college is running from these two class rooms facing the site of on-going construction of an impressive college building. Faculty of 8 teachers is teaching 7 courses (English, Hindi, Political Science, History, Economics and Commerce) to 129 students out of which 114 are girl students.

B. Vision Mission of the College:

Evolution through education and striving toward excellence not only in cognition and learning outcomes, but also in ability to work together with others, critical approach, communication skills and meta cognition.

C. Broad objectives of the College:

- To provide higher education in rural area and make students informed and responsible citizens of tomorrow
- To create sufficient physical and ICT enabled modern infrastructure to fulfil our vision
- To follow the noble practices in pedagogy ensuring inclusion, equity and accessibility to all
- To foster student-centric learning environment and widen the horizon of their thought process
- To inculcate in students sense of brotherhood, values for human life and empathy

D. Immediate Institutional Challenges & Concerns

- Extremely low student enrolment: This institution is faced with challenge to cater to higher education in an area with scanty population and low catchment with only two GSSS Schools as feeder schools resulting in very low student enrolment.
- 2. Poor infrastructure facilities: Simultaneously, only two teachers can take class in two rooms, which is not sufficient to engage 8 teachers teaching 7 subjects. Presently, the basic infrastructure for making library, IT lab, Seminar Hall, Girls Common Room, etc. is absent.
- 3. **Poor Institutional Image:** In the wake of huge infrastructural deficit, it is very challenging to build institutional image to attract students who prefer to take admission in nearby well established government colleges such as GC Nadaun (11 km) and GC Jawalamukhi (18 Km).
- **4. Poor Internet connectivity:** Extremely poor internet facility makes execution of day to day official routine work (biometric attendance, accessing Emails of DHE and replying in time) very difficult. Also it becomes difficult to cater to student services such as online filling of internal assessment, university registration, scholarship scheme, etc.
- **5. Financial Problems:** The institution is faced with financial problems owing to very poor generation of both external and internal resources due to extremely poor enrolment. Thin students' enrolment results in poor fee collection and PTA fund. In the wake of it, it becomes very difficult to support and fund extra co-curricular activities.
- **6. Poor Educational Background of Students:** The students from poor and backward community are coming to the college with baggage of poor academic background, lack of communication skills and lack of clarity about career goals.
- 7. Lack of Career Consciousness & Motivation: Career concerns, peer pressure, parental pressure, socio-economic backwardness of the areas are some of the challenges that students face.

E. Immediate steps to overcome the challenges before beginning of next session in July 2024

- 1. Enhancement in student enrolment: We propose take the following steps to increase the enrolment by 55% (129 to 200) by the commencement of next academic session;
 - Taking advantage of favorable teacher taught ratio, we are able to map students individually and make teaching-learning strategies, accordingly. We expect that this strategy will create strong teacher-taught bonds, align students with their respective goals, improve their academic performance and produce good result. With successful execution of this strategy, the happy & satisfied students will become our brand ambassadors to spread favorable word of mouth in the community which will definitely fetch us new enrolments.
 - We shall to visit nearby schools in the month of December to conduct orientation programme for out-going twelfth students and know their aspirations through feedback form. The feedback will give us sufficient time before commencement of next academic session for course correction and go to them again and again.
 - We shall approach transport authorities to add additional routes of buses to Vill Silh at college timings so that one more feeder school (GSSS Silh) could be added.
 - We shall approach the very amiable community and public representatives in Majheen and its periphery and tell them about our readiness with new college infrastructure before the beginning of next academic session as one block of new building is most likely to be completed by then.
 - The number of students in science stream in GSSS Majheen is showing increasing trend year after year and is presently 85 (43 in 10+1 & 42 in 10+2). The well-stocked laboratories along with all faculty position filled can fetch around 50 students each year which will roughly increase the enrolment by 150 after 3 years of starting science stream in the college.
- 2. Infrastructure Updation: We are in constant dialogue with contractor, PWD officials and local MLA to create sufficient urgency to complete and hand-over one block of the new building before the commencement of next academic session. Reasonably good pace of the construction work, proactive MLA and cooperative contractor are suggestive of the desirable outcome.

- **3. Improvement in Institutional Image:** With infrastructure, partially, ready before the beginning of next academic session, good annual result coupled with good word of mouth advertisement by happy students would be sufficient to polish the image of the college.
- **4. Improvement in Internet connectivity:** We are in constant touch with the BSNL officials to improve the connectivity in the area. Alternately, we are also contemplating to ask DHE for funds to install dedicated BSNL lease line if connectivity is not improved in next couple of months.
- **5. Measures to improve Financial Problems:** The financial condition of the institution would improve in the future due to following means;
 - We are committed to increase student enrolment before the ensuing academic session
 which would accrue more internal funds in the form of Amalgamated Fund, Building
 Fund, PTA Fund, etc. for spending in the welfare of the students.
 - Directorate of Higher Education has promised to give financial assistance to support our extra co-curricular activities.
 - We are an institution belonging to focus district and therefore, expect to get funding for our proposals under PM-USHA scheme.
 - We shall make small need based proposals and approach district administration for financial support.
- **6. Measures to tackle the Poor Educational Background of Students:** We shall take following steps to make for poor educational background of the students;
 - Creation of students support system through Mentor-mentee cell to monitor their mental and academic progress
 - Remedial Classes for slow learners
 - Certificate course on communication skills for the students
 - Facilitate scholarship schemes to the maximum students of poor and backward area
- 7. Career Counselling & Motivation of students: Following steps will be taken to motivate the students and spread career consciousness among them;
 - Frequent career counselling sessions to address the students' concern for their careers
 - Organizing motivational speeches to overcome peer & parental pressure besides

 More workshops/other programmes to update students, develop communication skills and boost their confidence

G. Problem of Big-Infra-Low-Enrolment Colleges

In recent years, there is growth of one special type of colleges in the state with disproportionately large infrastructure (physical as well as human resource) vis-à-vis extremely low student enrolment. If planning for such colleges is not done in time then they will become white elephants and continue to put undue financial burden, year after year, on the government exchequer. There is an urgent need to chalk out an affirmative action plan to

address to this problem.

Case Study of GDC Majheen

Present Enrolment: 129

Expected Enrolment by the beginning of next session: 200

Maximum Enrolment Attainable: 500 in ideal situation (If science streams and few vocational courses are started in the college and all the students from feeder schools take

admission in GDC Majheen).

Status of Infrastructure: Presently, the college is running with two class rooms. However,

the construction works of new impressive college building (Approximately, costing Rs 5

Crore) is in full swing and most likely, one building block (almost 60 % of the whole) will

be complete and handed over to the college by the beginning of next session in July 2024. This transition from meagre infrastructure to huge infrastructure (designed to accommodate thousands of students) would create imbalance of disproportionately large infrastructure & government resources catering to extremely low number of beneficiaries.

Probable Solution:

- The Department of Education is planning to implement NEP in the colleges of the state. In that event, some courses, for example, four year integrated BEd degree course should only be started, selectively, in such institution with big infrastructure and low enrolment. At the same time, this course should not be started in well- established nearby colleges, for atleast 5 years, to allow such institutions to stabilize & flourish. For example starting BEd course at Big-Infra-Low-Enrolment colleges such as GC Majheen, GC Khundian and GC Rakker and denying the same to well- established nearby colleges such as GC Nadaun, GC Jawalamukhi and GC Dhaliara, respectively, will probably divert the students and increase the enrolment at former ones. More such popular courses, like BEd course, can be identified and introduced, selectively, at such institutions for optimum utilization of government resources.
- Create necessary laboratory infrastructure to start science streams
- Start Vocational Courses

Report

Staff Training Program: "How to Prepare for NAAC Accreditation"

Date: 19th February 2024

Venue: College Seminar Hall

Facilitator: Dr. Chandan Bhardwaj, Principal

A staff training program on "How to Prepare for NAAC Accreditation" was conducted on 17th February 2024 under the guidance of the college Principal, Dr. Chandan Bhardwaj. The program aimed to familiarize faculty members with the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) accreditation process and to outline the preparatory steps necessary to ensure a successful evaluation.



Key Highlights

Dr. Chandan Bhardwaj began by expounding on various fundamental aspects of NAAC accreditation. He emphasized the importance of institutional accreditation in ensuring quality in higher education and enhancing the credibility of the college. - **7. Institutional Values and Best Practices:** Emphasis on fostering values, ethics, and sustainable practices.

Role of IQAC in NAAC Preparation

A significant portion of the session focused on the role of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in preparing the institution for NAAC accreditation. Dr. Bhardwaj detailed how the IQAC functions as the core of quality assurance and enhancement within the institution. He discussed the responsibilities of the IQAC, including:

- 1. Collecting and analyzing institutional data to prepare the Self-Study Report (SSR).
- 2. Implementing quality improvement initiatives across all institutional functions.
- **3.** Coordinating with faculty and administ ative staff to maintain records and compile necessary documentation.

4. Regularly monitoring progress and aligning institutional practices with NAAC

standards.

Interactive Session and Q&A

The session concluded with an interactive Q&A, where faculty members raised queries about

documentation practices, evidence collection, and quality metrics. Dr. Bhardwaj addressed

each question, providing actionable insights and strategies for overcoming common

challenges in NAAC preparation.

accreditation process and the preparatory steps involved. Dr. Bhardwaj's insights were

invaluable, and his guidance motivated faculty members to actively contribute to the
