

Internal Green Audit

Government Degree College Majheen, Distt. Kangra (HP)

Overview

The internal green audit was conducted at Govt. Degree College, Majheenlocated in a rural, hilly area. This audit aimed to assess and improve environmental practices within a small institutionwith inadequate infrastructure, 120 students (mostly from underprivileged backgrounds and predominantly girls), and eight faculty members, offering courses in arts and commerce.

Objectives of the Audit

- a) Identify current practices regarding resource use and waste management.
- b) Establish practical, low-cost recommendations to enhance sustainability.
- c) Encourage environmental awareness among students and staff.

Key Findings

1. Energy Consumption

- Electrical appliances include ceiling fans, basic lighting, and a limited number of plug-in devices.
- b) Lighting consists mostly of incandescent bulbs.
- c) Energy-saving practices were not widely implemented.

Recommendations

- a) Replace existing lights with LED bulbs to reduce power consumption.
- b) Promote a "switch-off" policy for lights and fans in unoccupied classrooms.

2. Water Usage and Conservation

- a) Water is sourced from a local IPH supply with limited availability.
- b) Minimal water wastage was observed, but there is potential for conservation improvements.

 b) Encourage students to take part in "Eco-Club" activities and lead small sustainability projects.

6. Action Plan

Immediate Steps (within 1 month)

- a) Implement the "switch-off" policy for lights and fans.
- b) Set up waste segregation bins in classrooms.

Short-term Goals (within 3-6 months)

- a) Replace all bulbs with LED lighting.
- b) Initiate water conservation practices and raise awareness about mindful usage.
- c) Conduct initial awareness sessions on environmental sustainability.

Long-term Goals (1 year)

- a) Establish a rainwater harvesting system.
- b) Set up a green area with native plants and medicinal herbs around the new campus that is being developed presently.
- c) Maintain an annual "Green Day" for student-led sustainability activities.

7. Limitations

The current green audit faces significant limitations due to the college's restricted infrastructure, as it operates from a modest, shed-like building with only two classrooms. This setting lacks the facilities typically required for a comprehensive green audit, such as designated areas for waste management, water conservation structures, and sufficient green cover for biodiversity initiatives. Additionally, limited space and resources restrict the scope of implementing certain long-term sustainability measures. However, with the construction of a new campus underway and expected to be completed within the next six months, future audits will have enhanced capacity for thorough environmental assessments and greater opportunities to integrate sustainable practices across a full-fledged campus. This new infrastructure will allow the college to adopt a more holistic and impactful approach to environmental responsibility.

Conclusion

The green audit identified several low-cost, high-impact measures that can help the college reduce its ecological footprint. Implementing these recommendations will foster a sustainable environment and create greater awareness among students and faculty. The college's proactive steps in addressing environmental issues will contribute to a greener, healthier campus over time.

Report on NSS Activities in Majheen Village (Session 2023-24)
