Government Degree College Majheen is located in the south-eastern region of District Kangra, approximately 10 km from Nadaun and 20 km from Jawalamukhi, in a rural and geographically serene setting overlooking the Beas River. The institution primarily serves students from economically modest and socially disadvantaged communities engaged in daily wage labour, small trade, and allied occupations.

Established in 2016 in a temporary facility, the college has progressed through phased infrastructure development. Following safety concerns, the earlier structure was replaced with essential academic rooms supported by departmental funding. Construction of a permanent academic building is underway, marking a significant transition toward long-term institutional strengthening. The college presently offers undergraduate courses in humanities and commerce with a committed faculty and a predominantly female student population.

Staff Orientation

Topic “Purchase Procedure”

Date of Session: 27 September 2024

Resource Person: *Dr. Chandan Bhardwaj(Principal GDC Majheen)*

A lecture was organised by Department of commerce on 27 September 2024 for the staff on “Purchase Procedure”. **Dr. Chandan Bhardwaj, Principal, Government Degree College Majheen, served as the Resource Person for this session.**The purpose of the programme was to help college staff understand the correct and transparent procedures that must be followed

while making purchases in government institutions. Since procurement is an essential part of college functioning, the session aimed to clear doubts and provides practical guidance.

Essential Points Explained

Dr. Chandan Bhardwaj began by explaining that all government colleges in Himachal Pradesh follow the rules laid down under the **Himachal Pradesh Financial Rules** and guidelines of the Higher Education Department. These rules ensure that public money is used responsibly and that every purchase is made in a fair and transparent manner.

Types of Purchases

Dr. Chandan Bhardwaj discussed different types of procurement commonly used in colleges:

- **Petty purchases** for small and urgent items.
- **Purchases through quotations**, where at least three quotations must be collected.
- **Tender-based purchases** for higher-value items.
- **Purchases through the GeM portal**, which is now mandatory for many categories.

Each method depends on the amount involved and the nature of the item to be purchased. **Role**

of Committees

Dr. Bhardwaj explained the roles and responsibilities of committees like:

- **Local Purchase Committee (LPC)**
- **Departmental Purchase Committee**
- **Stock Verification Committee**

These committees ensure that decisions are taken collectively and that there is no misuse of funds.

Step-by-Step Purchase Procedure

A clear outline of the purchase process was shared:

- The department identifies the requirement.
- The Principal approves the request.
- Quotations or tenders are invited depending on the amount.
- A comparative statement of rates is prepared.

- The committee selects the most suitable supplier.
- A supply order is issued.
- The items are received, checked, and entered in the stock register.
- Bills are processed only after proper verification.

He stressed that every step must be recorded properly to avoid audit objections. Proper record keeping was highlighted as an essential part of the process. All purchase files must include quotations, approvals, supply orders, delivery notes, and stock entries.

Conclusion: Dr. Chandan Bhardwaj provided valuable guidance on the purchase procedure followed in government colleges. The session was very informative for the staff. Many practical examples were shared, which helped in understanding how procurement should be handled in day-to-day work. Staff members gained more clarity on government procedures, committee responsibilities, and the correct method of making purchases. It helped staff understand the importance of transparency, proper documentation, and adherence to rules.

The two-days National Seminar held on **14th and 15th May 2025** on the theme "Social Inclusion and Sustainable Development in Himachal Pradesh: Looking Ahead" was successfully organized with enthusiastic participation from scholars, academicians, students, and dignitaries. The event served as a significant platform for multidisciplinary dialogue and knowledge exchange on issues crucial to the state's inclusive and sustainable progress.

Day 1 Highlights – 14 May 2025



The seminar commenced with a well-structured inaugural session. **Dr. Chandan Bhardwaj**, Principal Govt. College Majheen (host institution), delivered the inaugural address, setting an insightful tone for the event. He emphasized the critical need for a holistic approach to development that prioritize environmental stewardship and ensure equitable opportunities for all sections of society. He highlighted the urgency of addressing social economic disparities and fostering inclusive growth to achieve true sustainability. This compelling inaugural address had profound interconnectedness of environmental health, economic prosperity, and social equity. He stressed that sustainable development cannot be achieved without actively promoting social inclusion calling upon participants to explore innovative solutions that bridge developmental gaps and empower marginalized communities. His address served as a powerful call to action for collective responsibility in building a more just and sustainable future.

Sh. Sanjeev Vats, the Chief Guest, an eminent environmentalist with notable collaborations with the United Nations, delivered a compelling address. Mr Sanjeev delivered a truly profound lecture meticulously, dissecting the critical interplay between environmental sustainability and social inclusion drawing upon his extensive experience and deep understanding of environmental challenges. He commenced by emphasizing that true sustainability, transcend beyond ecological preservation. Instead, he argued it must be intrinsically linked to the well-being and Equitable participation of all segments of society. Mr. Sanjeev challenged the audience to look beyond traditional green initiatives, asserting that environmental solutions are incomplete without addressing the social dimensions. He elaborated on how vulnerable communities bear disproportionate burden of environmental degradation from pollution and resource depletion to impact of climate change, he underscored the powerful message that social equity is not just a moral imperative, but a fundamental prerequisite for achieving genuine environmental health. When communities are marginalized, lack access to resources or are excluded from decision making process, sustainable practices are difficult to implement and maintain effectively. Mr. Sanjeev moved beyond critical framework to offer practical pathways for integrating social inclusion into environmental strategies. This included advocating for fair and equitable access to natural resources, promoting green jobs that benefit local communities, fostering environmental education that empower all citizens and designing climate solutions that protect the rights and livelihood of vulnerable groups. He concluded by reiterating the critical role of scientific understanding, interdisciplinary collaboration and cross section partnership in advancing both

environmental sustainability and social inclusion and framed the central themes for subsequent discussions.

The keynote address was presented by **Dr. Sanjay Thakur**, Principal Government College Jhandutta, he delivered a compelling keynote address on the first day of the seminar focusing specially on environmental sustainability and social inclusion within the unique context of Himachal Pradesh. He spoke several critical points, such as Himachal's due identity of Dev Bhumi and tourism hub. Mr. Thakur began by acknowledging Himachal Pradesh as a Dev Bhumi. The land of Lords blessed with immense natural beauty. He highlighted that while tourism is a vital economic driver for the state, it also presents significant challenges to its fragile ecosystem and social harmony if not managed responsibly. The central theme for his address was the urgent need for a shift towards eco-friendly tourism. He stressed that growth in this sector must be meticulously balanced with ecological preservation and equitable benefits for all tourism. He asserted, it should not be a free for all, but a carefully curated experience that respects the local environment and culture. Mr. Thakur emphasized that realizing eco-friendly tourism, demands a strong collaborative effort. He highlighted that the government must enact and enforce robust policies while the local population must be given due consideration and actively involved in all stages of tourism. Planning and execution is called for ensuring that the benefits of tourism genuinely accrued to local communities. A significant part of his speech focused on the need for widespread awareness and fundamental behavioural change, he argued this change is required, not only from visiting tourists but also equally from residents and service providers within Himachal.

Adding a youthful and inclusive voice, **Divyanshi**, a first-year B.A. student, presented a thoughtful perspective on women entrepreneurship, her presentation was about the significant impact of empowering women through business ventures, contributing to the broad courses on sustainable development and social inclusion from a grass root level. Presentation showcased active student engagement.

In the afternoon, six technical sessions were conducted, wherein scholars and researchers presented papers addressing various aspects of social inclusion and sustainable development. These sessions served as crucial forums where diverse research scholars and accomplished academics from various institutions showcased their findings, debated on contemporary issues and

contribute to the collective knowledge on environmental sustainability and social equity. The lively discussions generated in these sessions highlighted the depth of engagement and breath of research being conducted in these critical areas. The most widely cited definition of sustainable development comes from the Brundtland report (1987) **“Development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generation to meet their own needs”**. These discussions touched various significant topics such as deep understanding of sustainable development and comprising environmental sustainability, economical sustainability, social sustainability, various global frameworks such as sustainable developmental goals. It was discussed in the seminar that how key aspects of social inclusion such as equal opportunities, access to resources, voice and participation, dignity and respect, reducing disparities are crucial for making a development truly a sustainable development. Various important topics significant specifically in Himachal Pradesh context were shed light upon through the discussion such as fragile ecosystem of Himachal Pradesh, tourism dependency and how to make it eco-friendly, hydropower development, bridging rural urban divide, livelihood and traditional practices, Climate vulnerability.

Each paper contributed meaningfully to the overarching theme, reflecting the interdisciplinary nature of the seminar.

Day 2 Highlights – 15 May 2025



Second day of national seminar commenced with the continuation of its vibrant academic program, featuring the remaining three technical sessions and enrich the seminar. These final technical sessions dealt deeper into specific sub themes of sustainable development and social inclusion building upon the foundation laid on day. Researchers presented their findings on topics, and facilitated rigorous academic exchanges, the seminar transition to its including segment featuring important speeches delivered by the chief guest for the day, invited speakers, organizing secretary. In essence a national seminar on sustainable development and social inclusion in a place like Himachal Pradesh is not just academic, It's a direct response to the state's unique opportunities and challenges, it aims to foster solutions that ensure both the prosperity of its people and preservation of natural heritage for current and future generation.

In addition to the extensive research presented by scholars and academician in technical sessions, the seminar was also enriched by the presence of two distinguished invited speakers. **Sh. Prakash Thakur** and **Dr. Amarjeet Atri**, These experts delivered valuable insights into the critical themes of sustainable development and inclusive growth, sharing their unique perspectives and experiences to future in the discussion. Their addresses served to draw the seminar's scope, offering expert perspective, real World case, studies and actionable recommendation that resonated deeply with the audience and stimulated further thought on the complex interplay of these vital issues.

The valedictory session was significantly enriched by the presence of our esteemed chief guest **Dr. Susheel Kumar Bassi** who currently serves the principal of government College Jawalamukhi. His address helped a special resonance as he was the steamed principal of our very own institution drawing upon his personal connections and tenure. He shared, compelling Anecdotes from his time he vividly recounted his concerted efforts to maintain an eco-friendly environment around the college building. He detailed how during his leadership initiatives were undertaken to foster a green campus, emphasizing the practical steps taken to promote environmental devotion. He reiterated that these principles are not new in academic constructs but fundamental to the holistic growth of an institution and society. His speech served as a poignant reminder that the ground workforce, stable and inclusive future is achievable through consistent dedication, efforts much like those champion during his time as principal of government College Majheen.

Throughout the day, participants continued exchanging ideas, further broadening the scope of discourse. The seminar concluded with a **certificate distribution ceremony**, recognizing the contributions of all participants, and ended on a formal note with the **National Anthem**.

The two-days seminar successfully brought together a diverse group of participants and experts, fostering rigorous academic discussions and practical insights. The well-organized sessions underscored the critical importance of integrating social inclusion with sustainable development, especially in the context of Himachal Pradesh. The event not only enriched academic discourse but also reinforced the need for inclusive policies and sustainable practices in regional development.

ज्वालामुखी, 9 दिसम्बर (स.ह.): राजकीय महाविद्यालय मझीन में करियर को लेकर व्याख्यान का आयोजन किया गया, जिसमें प्रमुख वक्ता विज्ञान और प्रौद्योगिकी मंत्रालय के इलेक्ट्रॉनिक्स प्रौद्योगिकी केंद्र के वैज्ञानिक डा. अजय कौशल ने कचरा प्रबंधन में रोजगार और व्यावसायिक अवसर पर व्याख्यान दिया। कार्यक्रम का आयोजन महाविद्यालय के प्राचार्य डा. चंदन भारद्वाज मार्गदर्शन में किया गया। कार्यक्रम में संयोजक प्रो. मोहिनी व प्राध्यापक उपस्थित रहे।

A lecture on burning topic of e-waste management with a focus on lithium batteries was delivered by Dr. Ajay Kaushal . Main aim of this event was to shed light on the rising environmental concerns due to the improper disposal of electronic waste, particularly lithium-ion

batteries, and to explore sustainable management practices to raise awareness about the growing concerns regarding e-waste, specifically focusing on discarded cell phone batteries. The session aimed at understanding the environmental impacts of e-waste, the importance of recycling, and its potential to generate employment to raise awareness about the growing concerns regarding e-waste, specifically focusing on discarded cell phone batteries.

Dr. Ajay Kaushal explained that Lithium-ion batteries are widely used in consumer electronics like smart phones, laptops, digital cameras, wireless headphones, electric vehicles, electric vehicles, mobility aids (scooters, wheelchairs and e-bikes), solar power storage toys, clocks and heart pacemakers. When the life of these items ends, then it is called electronic waste. As written earlier, batteries of all the items mentioned above contain Lithium, PC chips and circuit board. Earlier batteries contained Lithium and Cobalt. At present, India is dependent on China for these minerals.

Then he discussed about the dependence of India on China. He shared that rarer minerals are found in China. He further added in Kolar Gold Field Mines we need to do one ton extraction for 1 gram gold. For 100 grams of silver, we need to extract 1 ton of content and for 20 kg copper one ton extraction is needed. Simply means all these are very expensive. Along with other elements gold and copper are found in these batteries. Then the talk turned towards employment generation. Two kilogram battery shreds contain black mass almost of Rs 800/- Importance of recycling in the field of employment generation and e-waste management was elaborated. Importance of dismantling and segregation was discussed as after following these two steps, e-waste collector can get good amount. He further added that a windmill means 230Kg rare earth, a solar panel's intact glass has 20-25 years of life but it can be reused as it has purest Silicon which means value. In a circular economy, recycling exist for betterment of all. He acquainted the students with the concept of dry cell batteries, which are of no value as they cannot be recycled.

SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) were explained in the simplest possible way. He explained the term in two parts i.e. SW means internal factors as they are related to strengths and weaknesses and OT means external factors and in order to understand the scope in any business including e-waste management, we should analyze these four factors.

The lecture highlighted global and local e-waste regulations, emphasizing the importance of producer responsibility organizations (PROs) and take-back programs. He laid emphasis on public awareness and role of individuals. The importance of consumer awareness and responsible disposal habits was stressed. Practical advice was provided, such as using designated e-waste collection points and supporting companies with sustainable practices.

The lecture underscored the urgent need for collective action involving governments, industries, and consumers to address the growing e-waste challenge. The integration of innovative recycling technologies, stricter policies, and active public participation can pave the way for a sustainable future. The session concluded with an engaging interaction where participants shared their concerns and ideas, making it a thought-provoking and educational experience for all.

Analysis


A survey was conducted to understand the level of satisfaction of parents and guardians regarding the college, the faculty, and the teaching methods used on campus. For this feedback was collected from 45 parents and guardians to understand their views about the college. Most parents shared positive responses. They felt that the admission process is fair and easy to understand. Information about the college, its rules, and activities is available to everyone, which builds trust. Parents appreciated the discipline of the college and said that the campus environment is safe and supportive for students. They expressed satisfaction with the teaching quality and mentioned that teachers are qualified, helpful and teach in a clear manner. Many parents observed that their children have shown improvement in studies, confidence and regularity after joining the college. They also appreciated that the college provides useful career guidance.

Parents found the non-teaching staff cooperative and supportive in handling day-to-day requirements of students. Some parents had mixed opinions regarding the curriculum and learning experience. This shows that more communication about how the curriculum works or how it is updated may be needed. Opinions about recent changes in the college were also different, as some parents felt informed while others were not fully aware. Overall, parents are happy with the discipline, teaching, and supportive nature of the college. They believe that their children are progressing well. The main suggestion that emerges from the feedback is to improve communication about the curriculum and any new developments so that parents can better understand the academic system and ongoing changes.



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The Annual Review Meeting was conducted to evaluate students' performance and participation across academic, curricular, extracurricular, and extension activities for the current session. The committee reviewed learning outcomes, examination results, classroom engagement, and participation in sports, cultural events, NSS/NCC, and community outreach programmes. Based on the review, the strengths and gaps were identified. Action points for the next academic session were proposed with the objective of enhancing students' academic excellence, improving learning outcomes, increasing participation in institutional activities, and strengthening community engagement. The committee emphasized the need for continuous monitoring, timely interventions, and collaborative efforts by all departments to ensure holistic development of students and overall institutional growth. Briefly descriptions of **Academic activities, curricular activities, extracurricular activities and Extension activities performed as follows:**

- **Academic Activities**

All departments reported that the regular teaching work and syllabus coverage were completed on time. Internal assessments, class tests, and house examinations were conducted as per schedule. Teachers used ICT tools wherever possible to make classroom teaching more effective. Remedial classes were held for students who needed extra support, and faculty members also guided students through the mentor-mentee groups. The combined efforts of dedicated teachers, effective mentor-mentee practices and continuous students counseling led to remarkable results in the HPU examinations. In B.A.1st year session 2024-25, Divyanshi Rana achieved 1st position, Ms. Tamanna secured 7th position and Ms. Neha attained 10th position in university merit list. **(Annexure-1)**

- **Curricular Activities**

Along with the regular teaching work, students were given assignments, classroom presentations, project work, and small seminar activities in different subjects. These activities helped improve their understanding of the topics taught in class. Group discussions and small interactive sessions held by teachers encouraged students to express themselves more confidently. It has been noted that continuous internal assessment helped in keeping track of students' progress throughout the session. **(Annexure-II)**

- **Extracurricular Activities**

The meeting also reviewed students' involvement in cultural programmes, sports, and club activities. Students actively participated in cultural events organized in the college, and some participated in inter-college activities as well. The Sports Committee appreciated the efforts of students who represented the college in various events. Activities conducted under the Literary Club, Eco Club, and Road Safety Club helped in developing students' confidence and overall personality. However, it was felt that more students should be encouraged to participate in competitions at the university level. **(Annexure-III)**

- **Extension Activities**

Extension and outreach activities carried out through NSS, Road Safety Club, Red Ribbon Club and other committees were discussed. Students took part in cleanliness drives, awareness programmes, plantation activities, and road-safety awareness campaigns in nearby areas. These programmes helped create a sense of social responsibility among students and strengthened the college's connection with the community. It was suggested to increase collaborations with local bodies so that more meaningful outreach work can be carried out.

The review showed that students participated well in almost all academic and non-academic areas. Faculty members appreciated the sincerity shown by students, especially in community-related programmes. At the same time, the meeting highlighted the need to strengthen academic mentoring and encourage more active participation in sports and cultural events outside the college. Skill-based activities also need to be increased to support students' career development.

Action Points for the Next Session

- ✓ Provide additional remedial and tutorial support for slow learners.
- ✓ Encourage teachers to use more ICT tools and interactive methods in classrooms.
- ✓ Improve the regularity and monitoring of internal assessments.
- ✓ Motivate students to participate in university and state-level sports and cultural competitions.
- ✓ Organize skill-based training, short-term courses, and workshops.

- ✓ Increase the number of outreach and awareness programmes in nearby villages.
- ✓ Strengthen the mentor–mentee system for continuous guidance.
- ✓ Skill-based activities also need to be increased to support students' career development.



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
